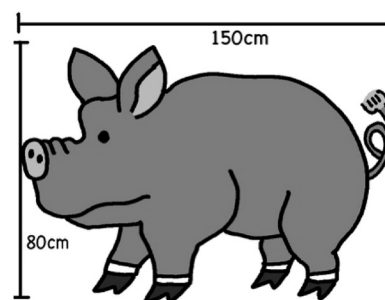
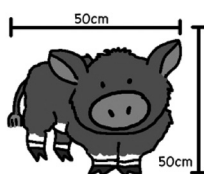
Welcome to BUBU Café!

During the COVID-19 pandemic, many strange and surprising messages spread quickly around the world. For example, some people said, “The coronavirus is weak against heat, so drinking hot water can stop it,” or “The COVID-19 vaccine*¹ can change your DNA.” ① These messages were not based (②-A) science, but they were widely shared. People saw them on social media, received them in messaging apps, or heard them in conversations. Sadly, in some cases, people believed dangerous advice, such as “drinking methanol*² can cure COVID.” Some drank this harmful chemical and died.

These are examples of fake news. Fake news means information that is false or not supported by facts. It can spread in many forms: writing, pictures, videos, or short messages. Fake news spreads quickly and can cause real harm. It can confuse people, make them afraid, and lead (②-B) dangerous actions. In some cases, it causes people to distrust science, doctors, or legitimate health advice.

Fake news is not only about the coronavirus. There are many other topics where it causes problems. There is fake news in politics as well as daily life. Even when meant (②-C) a joke, it can cause confusion. For example, after a strong earthquake hit Kumamoto, Japan, in 2016, someone posted online that a lion had escaped from the local zoo. This false message spread quickly. People in the area became scared, and the zoo received many calls. However, the story was not true. It was just a prank*³. Even though the person didn't intend harm, the result was real panic.

Another case happened in February 2020. A rumor, ③ saying that most toilet paper was made in China and that the supply would stop because of COVID-19, was spread. This wasn't true. News stations explained the facts and told people not to panic. However, videos of empty shelves made people more nervous. Many rushed to buy toilet paper, and for two months it became hard to find. ④ The rumor created the problem it warned about.

As you can see, fake news causes serious problems. It makes situations such as disasters, health issues, or major events worse. It also divides people and causes arguments. In politics, fake news can influence voting and change election results. Even a little fake news can make people stop trusting all news. That's why it's important to check if something is true before believing (②-D) sharing it.

One study in the United States looked at over 100,000 Twitter*⁴ posts. Researchers found that fake news spreads much faster than real news. It also reaches more people. The study

showed that true stories took six times longer than fake ones to reach 1,500 people. According to MIT News, fake news was 70% more likely to be shared than real news. These results show (⑤) powerful and dangerous fake news can be.

Why does fake news spread so easily? There are two main reasons. First, people enjoy surprising and interesting news. Real news is often calm and simple, but fake news can be exciting. Since it doesn't need to be factual, it can be ⑥ dramatic and creative. If it sounds true in any way, many people believe it and share it.

Second, emotions matter. On social media, people are more likely to share posts that make them feel angry, shocked, or scared. Fake news creates strong feelings like fear or rage, helping it spread faster. (⑦), positive messages are shared less.

So, what can we do? Today, it's easy to post or share information with one click. That's convenient, but we need to think first. When you see a post, stop and ask: "Is this really true?" If you're not sure, don't share it. Don't believe something just because many people say it.

It's important to get into the habit of checking facts and thinking for yourself. This habit protects not only you but also your family, friends, and society. If each of us takes time to think (②-E) sharing, we can reduce fake news and build a more trustworthy*5 world.
